Pax Christi Annual Spring Retreat April 12th

"Hope for the Long Haul: Finding our place in poetic time" is the theme of the upcoming Annual Pax Christi Massachusetts Spring Retreat that will be held at St. Thomas the Apostle Church, 1076 Thorndike Street, Palmer, MA on Saturday April 12, 2025. The retreat will be led by Brad Wolf, a former prosecutor, professor, and community college dean.
